GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETING A RISK ASSESSMENT:

POTENTIAL HAZARD	WHO WOULD BE HARMED	EXISTING CONTROLS	FURTHER ACTION REQUIRED
<p>Look for hazards which you could reasonably expect to result in significant harm under the conditions for your pitch and products being sold.</p> <p>Identify ALL Potential Hazards:</p> <p>Slipping/tripping hazards, chemicals (e.g. battery acid), moving parts of machinery (e.g. blades), vehicles (e.g. movement on site), electricity (e.g. generators), risk of fire (e.g. combustible materials, rubbish, flammable substances, LPG etc.) and ignition sources (flame, smoking, etc.), manual handling, lifting and carrying, marquee erection and weather related risks, noise, livestock on stands, health & hygiene standards.</p>	<p>There is no need to list individuals by name - just think about groups of people doing similar work or others who may be affected.</p> <p>Identify Who might be harmed?</p> <p>Staff, Volunteers, contractors, members of the public. Pay particular attention to: staff with disabilities, visitors, inexperienced staff, lone workers – who may be more vulnerable.</p>	<p>Have you provided adequate information, systems, procedures, instruction or training?</p> <p>If so, then the risks are adequately controlled, but you need to indicate the precautions you have in place.</p> <p>List controls already in place:</p> <p>For the hazards identified, do the precautions already taken meet the standards set by a legal requirement, comply with a recognised industry standard, represent good practice, reduce risk as far as reasonably practicable?</p>	<p>Is more control needed to reduce the risk? Where the risk is not adequately controlled, indicate what more you need to do.</p> <p>Identify ANY Training or preparation needed prior to the show:</p> <p>i.e. remove the risk completely, try a less risky option, prevent access to the hazard, issue personal protective equipment, provide welfare facilities (e.g. first aid, fire extinguishers), appropriate training for staff.</p>
